Learning Disabilities Review

About 5-10% of people have learning disabilities (LD) that affect reading, writing or math. Not surprisingly, LDs form the largest group of identified students in the Board. A newly-released Board report recommends three major areas of change, to provide earlier and more targeted support, to more children:

(1) **Enhance support for early identification & intervention:** includes making the Empower Reading Program, and targeted reading and math LD screening and intervention, available in every elementary school.

(2) **Modify structure of specialized elementary LD classes:** based on a one-year intensive, half-day semi-integrated model , with more strategically-located 5/6 and 7/8 classes that focus on specific student needs.

(3) **Building teacher capacity:** in regular and specialized classrooms, as well as enhanced Assistive Technology support.

The intent is to serve children with LDs in inclusive classrooms, reducing the need for specialized programs. The critical next step is to identify ways to build the resources and teacher capacity to support LDs in all schools. A consultation for parents of children in (or wait listed for) specialized classes will be announced after January 19th.

SEAC invites you to take a look at some of the key items on our fall agenda, the [OCDSB Student Achievement Report \(SAR\)](#) and the closely-linked [Board Improvement Plan for Student Achievement \(BIPSA\)](#). Together with the Board's new [Strategic Plan](#), these documents define the priorities and needs that will drive budget decisions this winter and spring.

The OCDSB has been drawing on reserve funds to provide services beyond those enabled by provincial funding. However, 2015-16 starts a three-year process to reduce the deficit and bring Board expenditures in line with Ministry funding. This winter, SEAC will be working hard with the Board to help [build a budget](#) that uses our resources most effectively to meet students' needs. Delegations to SEAC are always welcome.


