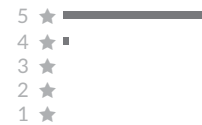

Smaller class sizes and more supports given to classrooms demonstrating high needs

When classes are too big it is hard to support all students. Also when classes are regularly evacuated, learning isn't happening and stress is high!

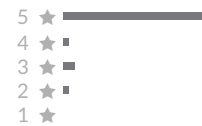
