Grants for Student Needs

- Announced on 12 April 2017
- EFIS Estimates forms scheduled for release on 21 April which will allow the District's funding to be determined
- Changes presented in GSN announcement:
 - Increased revenues to support contractual increases in compensation and benefit costs
 - Local Priorities Funding will allow positions to be retained and/or added
 - Investments to reduce class size in FDK and grades 4-8



Grants for Student Needs

(continued)

- Enveloping of the per-pupil amount allocation of the Indigenous Education Grant
- A 2% increase in the benchmark that supports student transportation costs
- A 2% increase in non-staff school operating benchmarks that support utilities, supplies and services
- Continued implementation of previously announced changes such as School Board Efficiencies and Modernization phase-in
- Continued FRP/SCI funding enhancements
